- Restitution to SD Counties (\$1,197,411.85)



 Our guests obtain and maintain full-time employment in the community. The St. Francis House is a key component to addressing workforce development in our community. Our guests are required to obtain and maintain full time employment. If they do not have employment when they arrive at the St. Francis house, they must apply for eight jobs each day and staff follow up to make sure they have completed their applications. The following are unique aspects of our programming:

- We have well over **100 employers** who regularly hire the guests of the St. Francis House.
- **85**% of our guests obtain and maintain **full time** employment.
- 20% of our guests maintain full time and part time employment.

Adam shared he only had one photo of his dad when he was an infant. I was able to send Adam photos and stories of his dad, so he had more than just one photo. We never give up hope!




This past year has brought many CHALLENGES to our guests as they begin rebuilding their lives.


Here are some of their SUCCESSES with work, completing treatment and celebrating paying off debt!

These vehicles were an incentive for our guests to pay off their restitution and child support to get their driver's license and then receive a donated vehicle.










A financial contribution to our agency, allows us to provide a warm and safe home for our guests to begin rebuilding their lives by building a stronger foundation for their future.
